Marchione bled to death on the deck of his lumbering B-32 bomber, high over Tokyo. He was the last U.S. serviceman killed in World War II, following an attack by a band of die-hard Japanese pilots who had decided to fight on. A longtime staffer of the U.S. Army's Soldiers magazine and now the editor-in-chief of Military History, Stephen Harding combines American and Japanese histories, personal memoirs, and his own interviews with many of the story's key participants to give us a portrait of airmen and their planes, full of bravery, cowardice, hubris, and determination.
